Tina Lynn Hayden came to the United Cerebral Palsy (UCP) for help to escape the abuse from her family and her caseworker at the Eau Claire Department of Human Services, Ms. Kathleen Leonard. This situation was well know by UCP staffperson, Ms. Donna Fortin.

Tina Hayden trusted UCP, but was betrayed, and 'stabbed-in-the-back' by UCP.
And you think that is appropriate?

Tina Hayden was not required to surrender her freedom, but UCP helped her lose her self-guardianship.
And you think that is appropriate?

Tina Hayden KNOWS she is being abused, and is still being abused, and is living in misery.
And you think that is appropriate?

Tina Hayden will never be allowed any more freedom to complain about being abused, because she is being socially isolated from any real, true friends. Social isolation is a form of psychological abuse, and is against state, federal, and international laws.
And you think that is appropriate?

Remember, when we each die, we will go before a real Judge, in a real Court, with real Justice, and that Judge has called legalists "hypocrites and a brood of vipers", then warned them of hell. Apathy, indifference, legalism, and cowardliness, have put more souls in hell than anything else. The apathy, indifference, and cowardliness of UCP towards the plight of Tina Hayden over the years is appalling.
